Social and Legal Issues in Eldercare

- I. The least restrictive environment:
 - a. Utilization of care managers.
 - b. Placements in locked facilities and false imprisonment.
 - c. Hiring in-home healthgivers: employees or independent contractors.
 - d. Mandatory care directives vs. healthy spouse's capacity to provide care.
- II. The durable power of attorney for health care going beyond the basics:
 - a. Dementia and intervening illnesses.
 - b. Care plan provisions.
 - c. Placement authority-based upon care plans and doctor affirmation.
 - d. Out of state agents and nomination of guardian waiver regarding out of state guardian's appointment.
 - e. Restrictions on termination of agent's authority if guardian appointed.

III. Legal and financial Issues:

- a. Tax deductions for cost of care.
- b. Annual gifts (or other gifts) vs. eligibility for nursing home entitlements; the sole purpose rule.
- c. Emerging issues of "care assessments" by Trustees.
- d. Stopping exploitation.
- e. Duty of spousal support for necessities of life and Medicaid as exception to this rule.
- f. The financial agent's gifting authority and the Medicaid look back period.

g. The "Affordable Care Act" does not change basic rules for institutional (nursing home) Medicaid coverage.
